

If you're looking for ways to reflect and recenter, the paths are there for you. The BPWA website offers a selection of self-guided itineraries to explore. And, thanks to young path supporters Jacob Lehmann Duke's and Zeke Gerwein's generosity, we are posting <u>5 new</u> <u>self-guided walks</u> each month. While out walking, please continue social-distancing and wear a face covering as required by local shelter-in-place rules.

BPWA's path improvement work continues. Thanks to our incredible supporters, we ordered handrails for newly built <u>Columbia Path</u>. We hope to share news of the installation in the next few weeks. Now that the rains have stopped, we hired a landscaper to clear a dozen paths that are choked with weeds and spring grasses. We are also hoping to slowly and safely restart our work parties in very small groups. If you'd like to lend a hand clearing the paths, please email <u>path.maintenance@berkeleypaths.org</u> to be invited to the work parties, if and when we can safely restart them. We are also happy to report that the City of Berkeley Public Works is conducting much needed repairs of two concrete paths this month: Redwood Terrace is complete and Bret Harte Way is next. Our All-Path <u>Survey</u> has been a valuable tool in our advocacy efforts with the City and helped prioritize this work.


Young Path Walkers Donate Book of 40 Berkeley Favorites to BPWA

In June 2013, Jacob Lehmann Duke (photo, right), age 11, and his friend Zeke Gerwein (photo, left), age 12, set out to walk every path in Berkeley in one day. "We walked between all the paths and never got on a bus, in a car, or on BART," Jacob triumphantly told <u>Berkeleyside</u>. Their adventure covered 36 miles and nearly 150 paths in 13 hours.

Jacob and Zeke went on to lead many walks for BPWA, and Jacob still serves on our board as a walks coordinator. For the past 4 years, the two friends have been working on a book of their favorite walks in Berkeley and beyond, which they had hoped to publish but are now making available for free.

Zeke and Jacob's book, <u>STEP IT UP: An Adventurer's Guide to Forty Walks on the Paths,</u> <u>Trails, and Streets of Berkeley and Beyond</u>, will be posted in installments of 5 walks each on the BPWA website over the next year, and we will announce each new series in our monthly newsletter.

"Now that that Zeke and I will both be in college and out of the Bay Area, I would like the book in its online form to be a gift to the path wandering community as a resource for self-guided walks," Jacob said. <u>Read more</u>



Berkeley Hills Living Features BPWA co-founder Jacque Ensign


The cover story in the the April 2020 issue of *Berkeley Hills Living* features none other than BPWA co-founder Jacque Ensign.


BPWA Supports Healthy Streets
