I've joined Elsa Tranter for her 101st beach cleanup at the Berkeley Marina, on January 23, 2021. Two weeks later, she will complete her second full year of weekly shoreline cleanups.

"Yr 2 wk 52 beach clean-up," she wrote on her <u>Facebook page</u>. "Berkeley bay at very low tide. Lucky seven dice; muddy boots and 4 bags of debris. And toward the end Colleen [Neff] showed up to document the dumping of the last bags into the garbage bins. An exhilarating and productive day."

Inspired by the humorist David Sedaris's storied daily quest to pick up litter in the South Downs of England and by an English grandmother who cleaned 52 beaches in 2018, Tranter, a long-time volunteer and recent board member of Berkeley Path Wanderers Association, embarked on her <u>Great Bay Area Beach Cleanup</u> in early 2019.


