Path Pal Diane Resek started volunteering on Berkeley Path Wanderers Association's path maintenance crew, and got (very) involved with path building 3 or 4 years ago. She was on

the small but mighty team that built out <u>Lower Columbia Path</u>, with 180 steps; and <u>Lower Halkin Walk</u>, with 145 steps; and the rerouting of <u>Wildcat Path</u>.

"I love the physical exertion," says Resek, 81, a retired SF State math professor. "For me it was really exciting to do something with my body that made a difference, and helped people."

Resek initiated the team's tradition of celebrating birthdays with mimosas, grapefruit juice, and a home-baked dessert, usually a fruit galette.

"There are 4 or 5 of us, and we really work together and get along," Resek says. "We enjoy each other." READ MORE

BIRD APPS FOR WALKERS



Sounds like an owl...

We were recently awakened by loud "hoo-hoos" outside our bedroom window, and while it was clear that this was an owl, we couldn't figure out where it was, and weren't sure what kind of owl it was either (though it was so loud that my wife had to go sleep in another room).

BirdNET (birdnet.cornell.edu) is a free app for both Android and iOS devices that lets you record bird sounds and then upload them to find out what bird is making the sound. It's a citizen science platform developed by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and the Chemnitz University of Technology to research whether computers can learn to recognize birds from the calls they make.


Out on the paths, I can often hear a bird but can't see it clearly (or get close enough to do so), and this app has been fun to use to figure out who is calling (except for crows, for obvious reasons...). READ MORE
