Tank House Tour: Discovering Berkeley's Forgotten WindPowered Wooden Water Towers

When: Saturday, September 3, 10 a.m.– 12:30 p.m.

Leader: Aaron Goldstein

Start: Corner of California and Fairview streets, Berkeley (near Ashby BART

Station)

End: Near <u>63rd Street and College</u> <u>Avenue, Oakland,</u> (near Rockridge BART

Station)

Distance: 2.5 miles

Accessibility: Flat. Well-behaved dogs

on leash are welcome.

This walk traces the history of a onceubiquitous but now largely forgotten piece of the circa-1900 East Bay urban landscape — the tank house. From the 1860s through the 1920s, windmill-topped water towers stood on nearly every city block, pulling up water from wells into elevated redwood tanks, providing pressurized water for domestic use. During their heyday, there were many thousands of these tank houses in the urbanizing East Bay. Read more

Rocky Berkeley



Start/End: Southwest corner of The Alameda and Solano Avenue

Distance: 4 miles

Accessibility: Some steep steps and uneven trails on the route. This walk includes 10 stairways, exploring rock features in the parks by climbing steep, carved steps. This part of the walk is not wheelchair accessible. Dogs on leash are welcome. Kids are welcome, too, if they are well supervised. An elevation gain of 817 feet.

We'll visit 7 of Berkeley's wonderful rock parks by following the <u>rock walk</u> (walk 10) laid out in *Berkeley Walks*, a guidebook



written by our board members Janet Byron and Bob Johnson. We'll enjoy the views, talk about the history of the parks and their geology, and do a little bit of climbing (optional!). Then we will loop back to the starting point. Please dress in layers and bring snacks and water. Read more



Sunset Hike in Upper Rockridge

When: Friday September 16, 6–8 p.m.

Leader: Alina Constantinescu

Start/End: Southeast corner of Broadway and Rockridge Boulevard, by the white pillars marking the entrance to the neighborhood. The meeting point is a half-

mile walk from Rockridge BART.

Distance: 4 miles

Accessibility: Many stairs and some uneven trails. Well-behaved dogs on leash

are welcome.

Grab your flashlight and start the weekend with an evening stairway hike in Oakland's beautiful Upper Rockridge neighborhood. This hilly hike packs over a dozen secret stairs in a 4-mile loop with winding streets, beautiful homes, and fun yard art. We'll loop around Lake Temescal in the glowing sunset hour and check out a nearby cascade (pictured). Read more

By the Bay, Berkeley and Albany

Start/End: SE corner of 4th St. and

Hearst in Berkeley **Distance**: 6 miles

Accessibility: This is a relatively flat walk with no stairs, but there is gravel and/or uneven ground here and there throughout.

We'll start by crossing the pedestrian/bike bridge at the foot of Addison and check out the newest parkland in the Berkeley Marina, Brickyard Cove. From there, we'll walk through the meadow on the north side of University and then along the shoreline to the foot of Gilman where we'll


